



USEA NOVICE/BEGINNER NOVICE THREE-DAY EVENT TEST PROCEDURES & POLICIES

Definition: To further preserve the Classic Three-day Format first initiated with the Training Three-day Event. Novice would include Phases A & C (Roads & Tracks), B (Steeplechase), and D (Endurance). Beginner Novice would include all phases; Phase B (Steeplechase) will focus on pace with the option to include jumping efforts. Organizers must combine educational components in conjunction with a competition format.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

USEA Registration – Eventing Test:

- N3D & BN3D must be offered in conjunction with a USEA Recognized Competition.
- Levels will count toward USEA Year-end Awards and AEC qualifications.
- Points awarded will be the same value earned at the CIC1* level, with the addition of clean completion points (no cross-country jump penalties) of 3 points.

Membership/Qualifications/Starter Fees:

- Riders must be USEA members. Horses must be properly registered.
- USEA Fees (Drug/Meds/Admin/Starter) of \$21.00 to be collected.

Qualifications:

- Beginner Novice: The rider must complete with a numerical final score 4 USEA Recognized Beginner Novice Horse Trials or higher.
- Novice: The rider must complete with a numerical final score 4 USEA Recognized Novice Horse Trials or higher.

Note: Horse Trials recognized by foreign NFs accepted.

Officials:

- Either the Technical Delegate or Judge must be a large R USEF Licensed Eventing Official.
- Course Designer must be a small “r” USEF licensed Eventing Course Designer.

Educational Components:

Organizers are strongly encouraged to offer “mini-clinics” with knowledgeable horseman of the Classic Format, i.e. upper level competitors, event officials and veterinarians, in conjunction with the Event that would provide the necessary education to safely compete in the classic format and build a solid base of good horsemanship skills. Following are suggestions of educational activities that should be part of the curriculum:

Cross-country course walks.
Jumping course walks
Equipment for cross-country...studs and more.

Scoring: In accordance with the current *USEF Rules for Eventing*

Dress/Saddlery: In accordance with the current *USEF Rules for Eventing*.

Show Jumping: Heights/Spreads/Drops: Horse Trials Specifications for applicable level.
