

2019 WORTH THE TRUST

Educational Scholarship for Young Adult Amateurs **

The Worth the Trust Scholarship is a fund of \$3,000 to be awarded annually to Young Adults who have declared Amateur** Status with the USEA and are between the ages of 16 and 25 as of January 1 of the scholarship year. Funds are to be used for any eventing education purpose.*

Deadline For Application Submission: October 1, 2018

(Must be postmarked by October 1, 2018 to be eligible; email and fax applications will be accepted. If faxing (703-779-0550) make sure application and essay are legible or they will be ineligible for consideration)

NOTICE TO APPLICANTS: Please read the rules carefully and abide by them when applying. Applications will be ineligible for consideration for any of the following reasons:

- Volunteer Hours not signed off by the Volunteer Coordinator
- Essays stating intended use of some funds to pay a clinician's expenses
- Essays stating intended use of some funds to pay a local coach who is not ICP Certified or on the USEF CCI2* Eligible Athletes List.
- Essays/applications faxed that are not legible.

CRITERIA:

- Applicant must be between the ages of 16 and 25 as of January 1 of the scholarship year and a current USEA member in good standing.
- Applicant should also be a member of their local eventing club or association.
- Applicant must also contribute a minimum of ten (10) hours volunteer work to either a national or local charitable organization such as Riding for the Handicapped, Horses in the Hood, any minority/disadvantaged group, local Eventing Association or horse trials, etc.
- All Volunteer hours must be performed in the 2018 calendar year and must be signed off by the Volunteer Coordinator. Unsigned
 hours will not be counted and application will be disqualified.
- Applicant must be a U.S. Citizen.
- Applicant must declare Amateur** status with the USEA (Amateur** status must be declared at the time of membership)

HOW_TO APPLY: Please write an essay explaining:

- Why this scholarship is important to you.
- How you intend to use the funds.
- What your ultimate goals are.
- · Essays must include financial need.
- · Please fill out the application form and send it along with your volunteer hours making sure that the work coordinator signs off on the hours.

USE OF FUNDS:

· Recipient must keep an accounting journal/log of their expenses including receipts for all lessons, clinics, etc.

This journal must be submitted at the same time the article and pictures for *Eventing USA* are sent to the USEA office.

- Article for Eventing USA magazine must be ready for publication for the 2020 May/June issue. Deadline for article April 1, 2020.
- Funds are to be used for learning to officiate, working with a Course Designer, Technical Delegate, Judge, Veterinarian, Organizer, etc*. Additionally, clinics, working student, private or group instruction with an instructor who is a current, or former member of the

USEF CCI2* Eligible Athletes List, or a Level II or higher USEA ICP Certified Instructor are acceptable uses.

- Funds cannot be used for pure dressage or pure show jumping instruction.
- Funds cannot be used for competition purposes.
- Funds must be used during a single calendar year.
- All expenses should be justified in writing (bills, receipts, etc.).
- Any monies used in an inappropriate manner must be repaid to the Scholarship.

SELECTION:

- Entries are to be judged by a USEA panel and Joan Iversen Goswell.
- The judges will be familiar with eventing but not necessarily a competitor, rider, or instructor.
 - A judge cannot be a relative of the applicant or involved with the applicant as an instructor or coach.
- The recipient will be awarded a check and certificate during the Awards Dinner in December at the 2018 USEA Annual Meeting and Convention in Long Beach, California.

RECIPIENT'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

• The recipient <u>must keep a record or a journal</u> of their activity and from this share their experience with other riders in the form of an article for *Eventing USA* magazine. Deadline for article April 1, 2020.
